



ACCS Assessment Code of Practice is to guide the conduct of ACCS trainers and assessors and includes four key responsibilities:

- It is the responsibility of those who develop assessment products and services to strive to produce assessments that are of the highest quality and meet applicable professional standards, free from bias, and accommodate special needs as required.
- It is the responsibility of those who select assessment products and services to conduct a review and evaluation of available assessment materials.
- It is the responsibility of those who administer assessments to inform students of the process of the assessment, to only issue those assessments to trainers for which they are qualified, provide opportunities for students to ask questions about the assessment, protect the students' rights and privacy, and accommodate any special needs.
- It is the responsibility of those who interpret, use and communicate assessment results to conduct the assessment activity in an informed objective and fair manner, provide to those who receive assessment results information about the assessment, communicate the results in a timely manner, advise any consequences from assessment results, and protect the rights and privacy of the student/s.
